



March 20 *The Wind Is Not A River* by Brian Payton

Many Americans are unaware of the Japanese invasion and occupation of two islands off the coast of Alaska during WWII. This historical fiction book is a grand tale of adventure and the devotion of a couple whose lives are changed forever in the aftermath of the only WWII battle to have taken place on American soil.

April 17 *The Gods of Gotham* by Lyndsay Faye

This historical thriller evokes 1840s New York City, where crimes and fires involving immigrants prompted the formation of the New York Police Department. Timothy Wilde is a new “copper” who is challenged by the ongoing discrimination, violence and political corruption.

May 15 *The House At The Edge Of Night* by Catherine Banner

A moving and charming family saga of four generations living on an ancient island off the coast of Sicily. The engaging characters pass on mystical island legends as they serve coffee

and limoncellos to locals and visitors at their bar, while living through World Wars I and II, the Fascist period, and the recession of 2009.




