




When Saya's mother is sent to jail as an illegal immigrant, she sends her daughter a gift which inspires Saya to help bring her mother home.




I Am Not a Number by Jenny Kay Dupuis & Kathy Kacer, illus. by Gillian Newland J 970.3 DUP

Children's Chapter Books




I Lived on Butterfly Hill by Marjorie Agosin, illus. by Lee White J AGO

A story about the power of choosing tolerance by the award-winning author of *Does My Head Look Big in This?* finds basketball enthusiast Michael attending anti-immigration rallies with his parents until a friendship with a Muslim refugee newcomer from Afghanistan compels him to question his family's politics.



The Tyrant's Daughter by J.C. Carleson YA FIC CAR

Exiled to the United States after her father, a Middle Eastern dictator, is killed in a coup, fifteen-year-old Laila must cope with a completely new way of life, the truth of her father's regime, and her mother and brother's ways of adjusting.

Separated from her detained mother after moving from Haiti to America, Fabiola struggles to navigate the home of her loud cousins and a new school on Detroit's gritty west side, where a surprising romance and a dangerous proposition challenge her ideas about freedom.
